Why do we often avoid talking about topics like faith & politics in public? Is it because we don't want to fight, or be challenged, or be ridiculed?

As the "Church" we are called to be <u>"salt & light"</u> in this world! But we live in a post-Christian society & our country is polarized spiritually & politically.

Our day has many similarities to the day in which these letters were written. Christianity was not popular then either & the political seen was chaos!

It's often said that pastors should never use the pulpit to advance a political agenda! I won't! But when the Word of God, & the gospel, speak truth into our politically crazed & spiritually confused society I cannot remain silent.

There may be a price to pay, but the cost of being silent is far greater!

The church in Smyrna paid such a price for taking a stand in their day.

- They faced religious opposition from those loyal to Rome & from the Jews.
- They faced political opposition in the form of poverty, slander, prison, death

But with great persecution, came great faith. Their pursuit of heaven proved greater than the threats of man to conform to the patterns of the world!

Jesus' <u>commended</u> this church for enduring in the midst of great opposition. They were one of two churches that Jesus did not confront. He simply commanded them to continue to be faithful, even to the point of death.

To be a follower of Jesus, and to speak the truth of God in our world, comes w/ great risk! It was true in the 1st century AD & it's true in the 21st century as well.

But we are <u>ambassadors</u> for the Kingdom of God, called to speak and represent that Kingdom in this world, no matter the cost!

So what does that look like in practice? How can we be a Smyrna church today?

In the words of the Apostle Paul in Romans 12:2 – "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect."

We need to do as the Smyrna church did & give Jesus the first & last word!

Revelation 2:8 - "To the angel of the church in Smyrna write: 'The words of the first and the last, who died and came to life.'"

The Christians in Smyrna, though mostly Jews & under Roman rule, owed their

allegiance to a different Kingdom, b/c of what Jesus did for them! So do we! We are in this world, but we don't belong to this world. Our allegiance is to Christ! What does it look like for us to give Jesus the first & the last word?
