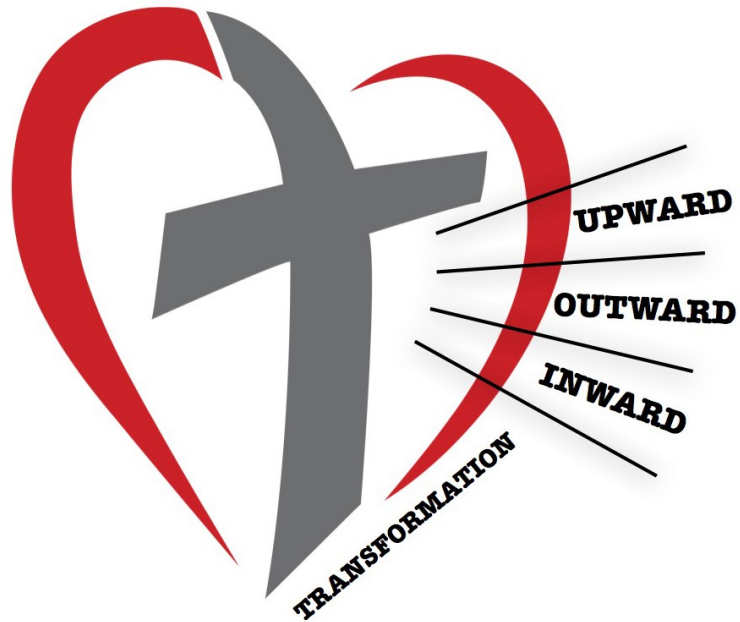

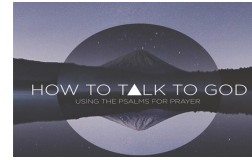

Who Is BRC? SERMON –BASED SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS

- 1) What have your prayers sounded like over the last few months? Have they resembled Pastor Dan's prayer on Sunday, King David's prayer in Psalm 6, or Asaph's prayer in Psalm 77? How have your prayers been similar and/or different?
- 2) Who is the main subject in your prayers, you or God? It's ok to use "I" and "me", when we pray, but if our first person singular pronouns far outweigh our references to God by name, title and pronoun, then our prayers are far too self-centered. How can we combat this?
- 3) Why is daily Scripture reading (including the Old Testament), and familiarizing yourself with the biblical history of God's relationship and interaction with His people Israel, incredibly helpful when it comes to prayer?
- 4) What is one strong emotion that you are feeling right now that you need to bring before God in prayer? Are there any Scriptures that can help bring a different perspective, a Godly perspective, to that emotion?
- 5) Write your own personal lament prayer. Start with your emotion(s), be transparent before God, but then move towards trusting God by reflecting on who God is and His track record throughout history! You can do this!!!

Heidelberg Catechism
