When you really stop and think about war, it is heartbreaking to think that we live in a world that it takes bloodshed to try to fix what has been broken!

What's really broken is <u>humanity</u> itself! And broken people tend to break things! There once was a time when this wasn't so, but you have to go all the way back to the Garden of Eden before sin entered the world!

God created all things good! And when He created man, He said it was "very good!" But sin took God's good creation and <u>destroyed it</u>! And it wasn't long after, that death became a reality within this fallen creation!

- Cain killed his brother Abel in cold blood!
- Wars broke out, to the point that God grieved that He even made man.
- God's prognosis "Every inclination of the heart of man was evil continually!"

As we celebrate Memorial Day today, & we remember and give thanks for those who have fallen in battle. Don't we also long for the day when death will be <u>no more</u>, & when the sin that leads to the taking of life will be overcome?

This day will come! Why? **1 Peter 3:18** - **"For Christ also suffered once for** sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that He might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit!"

The deaths of our fallen soldiers have made great provisions for us today, but the death of Jesus made the ultimate provision for us, for all of <u>eternity!</u>

"He suffered once for sins" – He experienced the most agonizing death, while fighting the greatest war that will ever be fought – the war between good & evil! And His sacrifice paid the ultimate price of sin – for all of time!

"the righteous for the unrighteous" – Jesus was not only fighting for a good cause, He was/is the cause of all that <u>is good</u>. Yet He suffered the death He did not deserve so that all of us who do deserve it might go free!

"that He might bring us to God" – Death brings us all before God, whether we accept that or not **(Hebrews 9:27)**, but Jesus brings us before God too. The difference is one brings fear of judgment, the other hope of <u>pardon</u>!

"being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit!" – Jesus' death is the only death that <u>brings life</u>! Those who have given their lives in service of our country have done so to secure our earthly freedoms, but only Jesus' death provides for, and secures for us, eternal life & heavenly freedom!

We were not only broken & blinded to the things of God by our sin, we were dead in our sins & trespasses. Christ's ultimate sacrifice made us alive!

Just as this Memorial Day weekend serves to remind us of the sacrifices that were given for our freedoms, let this day, and every day, be a Memorial Day to the Lord Jesus, whose sacrifice has made all things new!

We may miss those who have passed on from this life. We may miss our fallen comrades. But for those who are in Christ they are more than just a memory, for Jesus, their fallen comrade, is alive & therefore so are they!
