Psalm 1 & Hebrews 4:12-13

In Psalm 1 David sets up a comparison of 2 men:

- 1. Delights in the law of the Lord, like a tree planted by streams, yields fruit, strong and sturdy.
- 2. Walks in the counsel of the wicked, stands with sinners, and sits in the seat of scoffers. Like chaff

Which one of these people do you want to be?

David is clearly trying to tell all of us in this Psalm that <u>eternal strength</u> comes from following God's word, and the weak ways of this world will pass away and just be temporary.

• Jesus says the same thing in Matthew 7:24-27

The rains and floods were the same for both men, as life is for all of us, but the difference is the foundation that each one was built upon.

The Hebrews passage takes us in a different direction, it describes God's word as both <u>alive and powerful</u>.

God's word is sharper than a two-edged sword, meaning that everyone that reads it will be cut to their very core, slicing up our pre-conceived notions and other "truths" that we have learned over the years.

Ultimately, we need to change the way we think, so that we can change the way we act, and so we can change the way we represent Jesus Christ as his ambassador.

<u>Psalm 1</u> - Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers; ²but his delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night. ³He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers. ⁴The wicked are not so, but are like chaff that the wind drives away. ⁵ Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous; ⁶ for the Lord knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.

Hebrews 4:12-13 - ¹² For the word of God is alive and powerful. It is sharper than the sharpest two-edged sword, cutting between soul and spirit, between joint and marrow. It exposes our innermost thoughts and desires. ¹³ Nothing in all creation is hidden from God. Everything is naked and exposed before his eyes, and he is the one to whom we are accountable.

2 Timothy 3:14-17 - ¹⁴But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it ¹⁵ and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶ All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷ that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.
