May 5th National Day of Prayer Guide

1) God, who is someone in my life that I can have an intentional conversation with about my faith? Psalm 96:2-6 says "2 Sing to the Lord, bless his name; tell of his salvation from day to day. 3 Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous works among all the peoples! 4 For great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised; he is to be feared above all gods.5 For all the gods of the peoples are worthless idols, but the Lord made the heavens. 6 Splendor and majesty are before him; strength and beauty are in his sanctuary.

2) God, show me how I can worship you more intimately, how I can grow more in being your disciple, and how can I serve you better? <u>Hebrews 12:28-29 - 28</u> Therefore let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and thus let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, 29 for our God is a consuming fire. <u>2 Peter 3:18</u> - But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ

<u>Galatians 5:13-14 - 13</u> For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. 14 For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

3) God, I pray for the leaders in our church, I pray for our pastors, our staff, our consistory, our ministry leaders, our small group leaders. Lord, speak to me if you want me to grow in my leadership of the church. Also, God, show me people in my life that would make a good leader in our church.

<u>Ephesians 4:11-14</u> - 11 And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, 12 to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, 13 until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, 14 so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes.

James 3:1 - Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness.

4) God, I pray for our country, its leaders, and that we can stop being divided over so many things. Show me Lord, how I can be a peacemaker instead of one who separates people.

<u>Psalm 133:1</u> - Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity!

<u>2 Corinthians 13:11</u> - 11 Finally, brothers, rejoice. Aim for restoration, comfort one another, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you.

Heidelberg Catechism

Question 4. What does God's law require of us?

And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself. All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments.
