That question comes from the message of the Book of Ephesians:

- This book is all about Jesus Christ
- It’s different from our last 2 letters which were about correcting bad theology or behavior.

The letter is almost structured like a sermon, the first half talking about what God has done for us, and then the second half telling us how we need to respond in Christ.

Chapter 1: it begins with a beautiful Jewish style poem praising God for what he has done through Jesus Christ.

- From the beginning of the world God’s purpose has been to choose and bless a covenant family.
- That started with Abraham, but now is open to anyone through Christ.
- Not only are we adopted into God’s family, we are granted forgiveness for all of our sins, past, present, and future, and we find no condemnation, but instead we receive God’s grace.
- **Ephesians 1:9-11**
- Chapter 1 ends with Paul praying that we would not just know the gospel, but experience it and all of its power.

Chapter 2: Paul expands more on two of the major themes of chapter 1, God’s grace, and this new adopted family of God.

- He contrasts our old life with our new life in Christ.
- **Ephesians 2:8-10**
- Chapter 2 ends with a beautiful description of the church, now unified in Christ, living together in peace because of Christ fulfilling the law and breaking down the barrier of hostility between Jew and Gentile.

Chapter 3: Paul thanks God for the role he had in bringing the Gentiles into the family of God.

- He says this people don’t lost heart when they hear he is in prison.
- **Ephesians 3:17b-19a**

Chapter 4: Paul is challenging the church in Ephesus to respond to God’s Word with actions.

- Paul again stresses unity, but by bringing up the body of Christ metaphor he is saying we don’t need uniformity.
- In Christ, we are a new creation, and the church as a whole is a new humanity, therefore, we need to think and act differently than we used to before we were a Christian.

- We cannot stand on our own against these forces, so we must put on the armor of God.
- **Ephesians 6:14-17**

Scripture passages to go up on the Screen:

Ephesians 1:9-11 - ⁹ God has now revealed to us his mysterious will regarding Christ—which is to fulfill his own good plan. ¹⁰ And this is the plan: At the right time he will bring everything together under the authority of Christ—everything in heaven and on earth. ¹¹ Furthermore, because we are united with Christ, we have received an inheritance from God for he chose us in advance, and he makes everything work out according to his plan.

Ephesians 2:8-10 – “⁸ For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, ⁹ not a result of works, so that no one may boast. ¹⁰ For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.”

Ephesians 3:17b-19a – “And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, ¹⁸ may have power, together with all the Lord’s holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, ¹⁹ and to know this love that surpasses knowledge”

Ephesians 5:18b-21 - : be filled with the Spirit, ¹⁹ addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, ²⁰ giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹ submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.”

Ephesians 6:14-17 – “¹⁴ Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, ¹⁵ and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace.

¹⁶ In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; ¹⁷ and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.”
