The title of the book really just reveals who this letter/book is intended for – the Jews (God's chosen people)! They are the target audience!

"Jesus" is the main subject – which was for the Jews a major point of contention! "Let's talk about Jesus... you know the One you <u>reject</u>!"

The Jewish people did not accept Jesus as their Messiah - it is why they had Him crucified! But listen to the perspective given in **Hebrews 12:1-2**.

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of <u>witnesses</u>, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfector of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God."

The writer is saying, "This Jesus, who you reject as the all-sufficient Savior... is having coffee with God right now at His right side! And there is an abundance of witnesses who can testify to this truth – to His true identity!"

In the previous chapter (Hebrews 11), the writer lists several of these witnesses by name – and they are all the <u>heroes</u> of the Jewish people!
