A Brief History of Bells at BRC:

In 1981, 2 octaves of 24 Schulmerich bells arrived at BRC. In 1984, a 3rd octave was purchased. Much of the other equipment was donated. In 1999, a 4th octave was purchased. The choir played for BRC worship services and traveled to other churches and played

at other events over a 5 state area. In 2001, 4 octaves of chimes were donated.

The Ring and Rejoice handbell choir uses the 48 bells and 48 chimes to bring honor and glory to God through the use of these instruments. The American Guild of Handbells considers this ministry "a musical art form."
