 - Jealousy, or other times translated envy, is a sin that we are all familiar with, I'm sure. Envy causes us inward pain when someone else succeeds.
 - o It's the absence of gratitude, the absence of contentment.
 - Joseph's brothers saw their father favor Joseph, and that made them jealous.
 - Then little brother goes and tells them of a dream he had, where all of his brothers would bow down to him, and jealousy and anger quickly turned to <u>hatred</u>.

Scripture passages to go up on the Screen:

Genesis 37:2-11: ² These are the generations of Jacob.

Joseph, being seventeen years old, was pasturing the flock with his brothers. He was a boy with the sons of Bilhah and Zilpah, his father's wives. And Joseph brought a bad report of them to their father. ³ Now Israel loved Joseph more than any other of his sons, because he was the son of his old age. And he made him a robe of many colors. ⁴ But when his brothers saw that their father loved him more than all his brothers, they hated him and could not speak peacefully to him.

⁵ Now Joseph had a dream, and when he told it to his brothers they hated him even more. ⁶ He said to them, "Hear this dream that I have dreamed: ⁷ Behold, we were binding sheaves in the field, and behold, my sheaf arose and stood upright. And behold, your sheaves gathered around it and bowed down to my sheaf." ⁸ His brothers said to him, "Are you indeed to reign over us? Or are you indeed to rule over us?" So they hated him even more for his dreams and for his words.

⁹ Then he dreamed another dream and told it to his brothers and said, "Behold, I have dreamed another dream. Behold, the sun, the moon, and eleven stars were bowing down to me." ¹⁰ But when he told it to his father and to his brothers, his father rebuked him and said to him, "What is this dream that you have dreamed? Shall I and your mother and your brothers indeed come to bow ourselves to the ground before you?" ¹¹ And his brothers were jealous of him, but his father kept the saying in mind.

<u>Psalm 133:1</u> - Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity!

<u>John 15:18-19</u> - If the world hates you, know that it has hated me before it hated you. ¹⁹ If you were of the world, the world would love you as its own; but because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you."

Matthew 5:21-22 - ²¹ "You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgment.' ²² But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment

 $\underline{\text{Matthew 5:44}}$ - 44 But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you

Genesis 39:2-4 - ² The Lord was with Joseph, and he became a successful man, and he was in the house of his Egyptian master. ³ His master saw that the Lord was with him and that the Lord caused all that he did to succeed in his hands. ⁴ So Joseph found favor in his sight and attended him, and he made him overseer of his house and put him in charge of all that he had.

Genesis 50:20 (NIV) - You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives."
