



Heidelberg Catechism

Question 27. What do you understand by the providence of God?

Answer. Providence is the almighty and ever present power of God by which he upholds, as with his hand, heaven and earth and all creatures, and so rules them that leaf and blade, rain and drought, fruitful and lean years, food and drink, health and sickness, prosperity and povertyall things, in fact, come to us not by chance but from his fatherly hand.

Question 28. How does the knowledge of God's creation and providence help us?

Answer. We can be patient when things go against us, thankful when things go well, and for the future we can have good confidence in our faithful God and Father that nothing will separate us from God's love. All creatures are so completely in God's hand that without the divine will they can neither move nor be moved.

Our offering for 4/21/24 was \$8,049.58 towards the annual budget. The month-to-date total offering is \$27,608.29


Monthly budget-to-date is \$26,826.93
