Sermon Title: Names, different today than in the Bible

How many of you know why your name is what it is?

- Were you named after a relative, a character, or did your parents just like it?
- Do you have no idea why you were given your name?

Movie Quote: "I'm American, our names don't mean anything"

In the Bible names are very important!

• In Scripture, names are generally <u>descriptive</u> of the person, of his position, of some circumstance affecting him, hope entertained concerning him, etc., so that "the name" often came to stand for the person.

Some Examples:

• Adam: Ground or Dirt

Noah: Relief or Rest. Gen 5:29, Gen 8:21

• Daniel: God is my judge

• Elijah: My God is Yahweh

• Esau: Hairy

• Isaiah: Yahweh is salvation

• Joshua: God Saves.

• Jesus: He will save his people from their sins

• Job: Persecuted

• Zechariah: Yahweh remembers

The reason that I am talking about names, is that today starts a new sermon series for us here at BRC, and it is a sermon series about names, identities, and most importantly, people who have had their name changed by God.

• Each time that happened it changed the trajectory of their life drastically, and always in a good way.

Have you ever stopped to think about what God's name is and why?

- In Exodus 3, Moses is talking to God in the burning bush, and he is the first to ask God what his name is, and God's response is amazing, he says Yahweh, which means, I am what I am.
 - o God is unique
 - o God's name is the reason for existence

God has many other names in Scripture:

Jehovah

Elohim: Mighty

Adonai: Lord

El Shaddai: God is sufficient

• Alpha and Omega: the beginning and the end

• Jehovah Jireh: The Lord provides

• Jehovah Rapha: The Lord Heals

• Jehovah Nissi: The Lord is our Banner

• Jehovah Shalom: The Lord is our Peace

Jehovah Raah: The Lord is our Shepherd

• Jehovah Seli: The Lord, my Rock

• Jehovah Hamelech: The Lord, my King

• Jehovah Shammah: The Lord who is present.

What does your name mean?
Does that meaning have significance for you? If so what is it?
Challenge: I want you to think about a scenario, a what if; what if God
came down later today and changed your name, what would he change it
o, and why?
Ask yourself, what does God see when he looks at me?

- Most recently I got my favorite name I've ever been called, and that's Pawpaw
- That name is significant because of what it represents.
- What is your favorite name or title that you have and why?
- God's names mean something too, He is who He is, which also means that we can't just make up a name for Him or make him what we want him to be!
