### WHAT WE BELIEVE – God Forgives

# Psalm 103:1-13

We are currently offering a class here at church called "Getting Started", which is the class people take when deciding about becoming a member...

Last week I shared with the class "Reasons to <u>leave a church!</u>" Strange right? Why I share this with the class & reference it today, is because at some point every one of us will ask, or entertain, the question "Should I leave the church?"

Often the reasons for wanting to leave are: The pastor said... someone did... someone wouldn't... I heard about... my loved one experienced... that decision...

There are valid reasons for leaving a church, but an unwillingness to forgive is not one of them! And yet it is one of the main reasons people walk away!

Ask yourself, "Have I ever considered leaving a church because of <u>someone</u> else, or something someone said/did that made me angry & want to leave?"

If the answer is "yes", then why are you still here? It's most likely b/c you chose to forgive, or someone chose to forgive you & it made all the difference!

Forgiveness can heal the deepest wounds! But unforgiveness is like a <u>stick</u> of <u>dynamite</u> in a church... a family... a place of work... a neighborhood...

I want us to think about a few questions on this topic of forgiveness today:

- Why is it so hard to forgive?
- Who are the hardest people to forgive?
- When does it get easier to forgive?
- What can we do to work towards forgiveness in our lives?

# Why is it so hard to forgive? Sin done against us hurts... Sin within us deceives... & Sin among us divides... Who are the hardest people to forgive? Those closest to us... Greatest hurt... Repeat offenders... Should know better... When does it get easier to forgive?

Not tomorrow... Not when you feel like it... Not even when they ask for it...

4) What can we do to work towards forgiveness in our lives?

Receive God's forgiveness... Choose to forgive as we have been forgiven... Trust God as the all-knowing, all-righteous, all-gracious, all-loving <u>Judge!</u>

You might be thinking, "This all makes sense, but it's not that easy!"

It isn't easy, but <u>it's possible</u> with the help of the One who never holds on to unforgiveness... And the One who perfectly models forgiveness for all of us!

If anyone had good reason to find it hard to forgive it would be God!

He created us... Called us His own... Sent us a Savior... Reconciled us... & yet...

We turn away... Kill... Reject His gift of salvation... Hold on to unforgiveness... But God shows us a different way... Micah 7:18-20... The Jesus Way!

It couldn't have been easy for Jesus to forgive... Consider all He endured on His journey to the cross, & yet He chooses forgiveness! Video - Forgive

Can you imagine forgiving, and asking God the Father to forgive, the people who treated you in such ways? Nothing that's been done to me compares!

And Jesus didn't wait for a time when it would be <u>easier</u>... He forgave while hanging/suffering/dying on the cross! What does that teach us about timing?

So who do you need to forgive... today... no matter what they've done... even if they aren't asking for it... But simply because you have <u>received</u> forgiveness, from the same One who can empower you to forgive others!

Remember, Jesus forgave his firing squad... His friend who denied Him... tax collectors... His persecutor (Saul)... adulterers... His own unfaithful bride (Church)...

So who do you think you can't/shouldn't/don't want to forgive, but know you need to, because God calls all of us to forgive as we have been forgiven?
