Steven Davis



Steven "Steve" Davis was raised in El Paso, TX, and came to faith early in childhood. At the age of 7, Steve first mentioned becoming a pastor, and at age 9 in 3rd grade, others prophetically shared of Steve entering into Christian ministry. At age 13, Steve came to embrace the gift of faith in Christ for himself, and the next year heard and embraced the call to ordained pastoral ministry as his own.

Rev. Steve Davis came to Plymouth Church UCC in downtown Seattle in July 2016 and served in co-leadership as the Executive Minister. He is now in

Texas seeking God's next place for life and ministry. Rev. Davis has been serving in ministry for 36 years, starting as a student/pastor at the age of 19 while going to undergraduate school at McMurry College in Abilene, Texas, with a double major in Religion and Psychology, earning a Bachelor degree in 1987, and a Master of Divinity from Emory University, Candler School of Theology, in Atlanta, Georgia in 1990.

For 26 years, Rev. Davis served in the United Methodist Church, as a leader in parish ministry of congregations from 20 to over 700 in weekend worship attendance. He has served on church staff as Associate Minister, as well as Pastor and Senior Minister, where he gave leadership and vision with large support and program ministry staffs. His work as Evangelism Coordinator in the New Mexico and North Texas Conferences of the UMC, and his work as Chair of the Pacific Northwest Conference UCC Church Development Committee were fueled by his passion to see congregations become healthy, vibrant places of ministry and outreach to serve the community and communicate faith with integrity, justice, grace and hope

Rev. Davis was forced to leave the UMC when he came out. He then continued to respond the God's call on his life as he pursued ministry in a denomination where his whole life and experience could be lived in authenticity, acceptance and grace. While seeking ministerial authorization in the United Church of Christ through the South Central Conference, Rev. Davis worked in his local community as Project Coordinator for Process Improvement for a leading global company which produced radiation detection devices for many different industries. He has also served for 1½ years as the Supply Minister for The Gathering of San Angelo UCC, a new congregation start in central Texas, before his move to Seattle.

Rev. Steve Davis has 4 grown children, Erin, 30, Jacob, 25, Meagan, 21 and Jon, 20, a 7 year old grandson, Christopher, and is a dog lover and a growing fondness for some cats too! Steve and his husband, Bill, were married in Texas, May 28, 2017. Steve loves football and basketball, with interest in baseball and soccer as well.
