Reimagined in The Words of Her Mouth: Songs for the Struggle

The great God, Composer of the Universe, asked you for a new song and eventually a new song was produced. Others gaze at it in wonder and ask the question that has been asked of newborn things since questions began: where did it come from?

Myths abound. Perhaps it grew round and unwieldy like a cabbage. Maybe it flew in a stork's beak. The truth is stranger than any story. You conceived the new song just like you conceive anything else. There's sometimes a bit of joyful fumbling in the conception, but the process is energetic and leaves you happily, sweatily breathless.

The gestation period, following that first flush of excitement is long and uncomfortable. Sometimes there are sleepless nights, there is usually nausea. Everyone will have an opinion about what you might do to relieve the symptoms. Do not listen to them. Listen within. The hours just before the final production are usually the most intense. Still and again, everyone will have an opinion. Still and again, do not listen to them. Stretch yourself, impossibly. Push. Breathe. Listen for the voice of the new song.

When at last it is born, hold the new song up to the light. Like all newborn things, it's not as adorable as you've been led to believe it would be. It emerges misshapen, squalling, slimy. Do not despair. All newborn songs start this way. Its beauty will grow like the song itself grows-sometimes swiftly, sometimes slowly. Until now, you have nourished the new song. Soon it will crawl and explore and run away from you. Soon the new song will sing itself.
